Topics include: sigma-algebras, outer measures, measures, Caratheodory extension theorem, measurable functions, integration, limit theorems, comparison of Lebesgue and Riemann integrals, modes of convergence, product measures, Fubini's theorem, signed measures, Hahn-Jordan decomposition, Radon-Nikodym theorem, differentiation, Lp spaces and their duals. Other topics as time permits.

**Grading** Homework, midterm and a final exam will be used to determine your grade for the course. You may discuss the homework problems with each other, but you must write up your own solution to hand in. The final exam is scheduled for Mon, Dec 9, 12:45pm-2:45pm.
