Prerequisites: 12 credit hours of calculus or equivalent. Credit will not be given for both MAT 514 and MAT 485

Students Must Know Before Taking This Course: partial derivatives, evaluation of integrals, integration by parts, elementary linear algebra

Learning Goals of the Course: Understanding the basic concepts and mathematical development in ODEs, mastering the basic techniques in solving the equations, ability to do hand calculations accurately and appropriately in finding the solution.

Course Description: This course introduces students to basic topics of ordinary differential equations. We shall cover the following topics:

- Classification of Differential Equations
- Method of Integrating Factors
- Separable Equations
- Exact Equations and Integrating Factors
- The Existence and Uniqueness Theorem
- Second Order Linear Equations
- Linear Independence and the Wronskian
- Complex Roots of the Characteristic Equation
- Variation of Parameters
- Laplace Transform
- Systems of First Order Linear Equations
- Matrices, Eigenvalues and Eigenvectors

Homework, Quizzes, Exams and Grading: There will be an in-class midterm exam and a comprehensive final examination.

- Homework: Homework will be assigned on a regular basis but will not be graded.
- Quizzes: 30%. Quizzes will be given weekly.

- Midterm Exam: 30%
- Final Exam: 40%. The final exam will be on May 7 (Tuesday), 12:45 PM 2:45 PM.

Make-up Exams: The usual policy for a missed exam is that, if a student can justify the absence and informs the instructor **before** the midterm exam, then the student's grade on the relevant portion of the final exam will be substituted for the missing grade.
