Prerequisites: MAT 275 or CIS 275, and MAT 331. (Or graduate standing).

Course Description: The course will cover parts of Chapters 1-6 with possible additions. The goal of the course is to give a rigorous, abstract treatment of vector spaces, linear transformations, inner products, eigenvalues, and diagonalization.
