Course description. The course covers representation theory of artin algebras with an emphasis on the Auslander-Reiten theory and representations of quivers.

Material covered. Chapters I–VIII with some omissions.

Grading and evaluation. There will be assigned homework problems in order for you to keep up with the development of the material. Your answers will be assessed either by oral presentation (based on written work) or by being collected. Your grade will be based on these homework problems.
