Mathematics Prerequisite: MAT 397 or graduate standing in mathematical sciences. Credit will not be give for both MAT 414 and 485. Students are expected to be able to take partial derivatives, set up and evaluate integrals, and do integration by parts.

Course Description: We will cover parts of Chapters 1-3, 6, and 7. We will study differential equations of first and second order and also systems of first-order equations. A number of methods, including the Laplace transform, will be used to solve such equations and to understand the behavior of solutions. Applications in sciences and engineering will also be considered.
