Text: There is no required text. Some references will be provided.

**Topics:** The course is a continuation of homological algebra MAT 732. The plan is to discuss some fundamental (co)homology theories appearing in the algebraic realm (and in the algebro-geometric, complex analytic, topological realms). For most of these, some basic theory needs to be discussed first. Some possible topics are (in no particular order):

- Koszul complexes and Koszul homology, the Cech complex
- differential graded algebras and resolutions
- simplicial methods and possibly Andre-Quillen homology
- Kahler differentials, relation to singularities, and possibly de Rham cohomology
- Hochschild homology and the bar resolution
- sheaves (topological or algebro-geometric), bundles, and sheaf cohomology
- stable/Tate homology

Clearly this is far too much material, so only a proper subset can be covered.

**Prerequisites:** The class will modulate between the simple beginnings of and the more complex aspects of the topics. I expect students with completely mixed backgrounds. In particular, if you have not had algebraic geometry or topology, you are still welcome in the class. Each topic will have an extended basic portion, understandable to all who have had MAT 732, and then ramp up to an advanced part that is aimed at the more senior students. Hopefully, this class will give you an introduction to various fundamental theories that appear again and again in many connected fields.

Work: Approximately every 2 to 3 weeks, when I have covered a reasonable set of material, we will have a "problem session class". You should come to class having read the notes from those weeks, and we will spend the class in two ways: (1) reviewing the main definitions and results (you will put them on the board) and (2) working on some examples or problems that I provide to help the material make more sense and sink in better! Your grade will be based on your active participation in this activity.
