<u>Course Objective</u>: The goal is to develop skills needed by a statistical consultant and to expose students to a wide range of statistical applications. Topics include data analysis, problem solving, issues in planning experiments, collecting data, report writing, and oral communication with clients.

<u>Course Outline</u>: We will spend first several weeks to review important and frequently used statistical analyses. Then, we will go over case studies and have class discussion on actual problems, either from clients or from the instructor's database. Guest lectures are also planned where the guest shares his/her consulting experiences.
